The Monthly D.O. reports are meant to refulect the various aspects of the For st Administration in each circle of the State., and that is the only source by which the problems and the performance of each Conservator of Forests in his circle are assessed. It was, therefore, Considered necessary to have a standard proforms of the monthly D.O. report and the Conservators of Forests are requested to high light their activities under the following headings.

- 2. There is considerable delay in receipt of monthly D.O. reports from the Conservators of Forests in the office of the Chief Conservator of Forests. The Conservators of

Forests are requested to see that the monthly D.O. reports are drafted in time and that they are received by the Chief Conservator of Forests, Addl. Chief Conservators of Forests-I II and II by 15th of the succeeding month.

- According to section 109 of the Andhra Pradesh Forest Department Code, the Conservators of Forests are expected to spend on an average (15) days in camp during each month and the Conservators of Forests are therefore requested to see that they spend maximum time in the field.
- 4. These instructions shall come into effect atomic and the monthly D.O. for the month of February 1977 should be send in the prescribed proforms by 15th March, 1977. DEPARTMENTAL TEST NOTES FAMILY SHORT NOTES (Ruling 1 under Rule2(iii) of T. A. Rules.

The following points to be noted while treating a person as the member of Grvt. Servent's family for the purposes of Travelling Allowance:-

(i) He should be wholly dependent on to Govt. Servant and residing with him.

(ii) Parents of a Gazetted Officer shall not be treated as members of his family.

(iii) Parents do not include adopted-father, adopted-mother Step-father, Step-mother.

(iv) When the Government Servant has more than one wife, claim for T.A. shall be limited to one wife only.

(v) When both nusband and wife who are employeds of the A.P. Government are transferred at the same time or within six months of his/her transfer, from one and the same old station to one and the same new station, only one of them shall be entitled to travelling allowance as on transfer, the other being treated as a member of his/her family not in the employment of the A.P. Government (Note 3 under Rule 2(iii))

Who are treated as members of the family; i) Winfe/Husband, (ii) Children (iii) Step Children (iv) Adopted Son (v) Parents in the case of NGOs (vi) Married daughter not placed under protection of her husband (vii) Widowed daughter.

who are not treated as mambers of the family; - i) Adopted daughter, ii) Married daughter placed under the protection of her husband iii) Darants in the case of Gazetted Officer iv) Brother, v) Sister.
