## CIRCULAR NO. 14/78

Sub: - Issue of C.F.140 Receipts - Defects in present supply of Books - Instructions - Issued.

- 1. While examining a case against a Forester, it was noticed that the receipts in C.F.140 do not indicate whether they are original or duplicate.
- 2. When a stock of C.F.140 receipts books was closedy examined, it was found that in most of the books the machine Nos. printed are in different types (Original in small letters duplicate and triplicate in big letters) and further the works "Original" "Duplicate" "Triplicate" are not printed at all.
- J. It is therefore directed all the Conservator of Forests and Divisional Forest Officers who are incharge of receipt of revenue and issue C.F.140 books to immediately stop the usage of such books which have the above irregularity after throughly checking all the C.F.140 books in stock. They should return all such books to the Director of Printing and Stationary.
- 4. All the Officers are requested to acknowledge the receipt of the Circular and take immediate action to suspend the use of such books containing such errors.

## FOREST DEPARTMENT TEST - FOREST LAW SHORT NOTES

Public Servant: - "Public Servant" is a wider term than "Government Servant", - Public Servant need not be in the pay of the Government but a Sovernment servant is necessarily in its pay section 21 of the I.P.C. gives an exhaustic list of persons who are deemed as public servants - public servant is one who has to discharge some public duty. All Government Servants need not be public servants. As per Section 61 of A.P. Forest Act of 1967 all Forest Officers are public servants.
