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DEPARTMENTAL TEST FOREST LAW (Short Notes)

EASEMENT:-

An Easement is a right which a owner or occupier of a certain land possesses for the beneficial enjoyment of that land to do and to continue to do something or to prevent something being done, in or upon, or in respect of certain other land which is not his own.

(Vide Article 4 of the Indian Easement Act).

TRANSIT MARK:-

This is a mark used for timber exceeding 25 cms in girth at its thickest part and one metre in length except timber sawn into or from or within the State of A.P. unless such timber bears a distinguishable Govt. "transit mark" of such description as mentioned in the permit authorizing transit thereof accompanying the said timber.

(Rule 4 of A.P. Forest Produce Transit Rules 1970)

CRIMINAL BREACH OF TRUST:-

Whoever being in any manner entrusted with property, or with any dominion over property, dishonestly misappropriates or converts to his own use that property, or dishonestly uses or disposes of that property in violation of any direction of law prescribing the mode in which such trust is to be discharged, or of any legal contract, express or implied, which he has made touching the discharge of such trust, or wilfully suffers any other person so to do, commits "criminal breach of trust".

(Vide Section 405 of the Indian Penal Code).
