Su Sub: Forest Offences - Checking up cases by R.Os, Sub-D.F.Os and D.F.Os - Tercentage - Fixed.

There are no uniform standing instructions prescribing percentage of enquiry of offence cases by the Range Officers. A suggestion has been made, that Range Officers be instructed to enquire into atleast 20% cases and the Divisional Forest Officers 10% of cases.

- 2. As per rule (4) of the A.T. Forest Offences (Compound and Prosecution) Rules, 1969 in enquiry into a forest offence shall be held by an officer not below to rank of Range Officer except those where the accused expressed willingness to have the offence compounded. Thus, if the accused does not give a compounding statement, the case will necessarily has to be enquired into by an officer not below the rank of a Ranger. An enquiry into offences of grave nature may be necessary, in case it is proposed to prosecute the accused.
 - Therefore all cases in which the accused refuses to give compounding statements, that is to say, all cases requiring prosecution and cases under section 52 or 55 are are required to be enquired into under rules, either by the Range Officer, Sub-Divisional Forest Officer or Divisional Forest Officer according to the situation and convenience.
 - 4. In respect of the cases in which the accused agrees to compounding, an enquiry of elaborate nature is not required except in respect of cases where action is contemplated under section 44(?-A) for confiscation of forest produce together with vehicles etc. In this connection, the question that with vehicles etc. In this connection, the question that arises for consideration is whether a case reported is genuine or not, for action u/s 59. AGENT The Gov. may for the purpose of purchase of and trade is any MFP on their behalf, appoint an agent for each unit.
