CIRCULAR NO. 5/78

Sub: -MAPS-Plantations-Divisions and Ranges.

It has been under consideration for sometime past to have a wall map (Not to the scale if need be) showing therein all the Reserve Forests and Plantations raised from 1961 onwards. The wall map should be on a plywood board of 10' length and 10' breadth (square).

The Conservators of Forests Office also should have similar wall map containing information for each Division showing the blocks and plantations. All the Officers are requested to implement the above decision immediately.

Distinguish between

Cognizable Offence

Non-cognizable offence

| 1. The Police can take cognizance and set the machinery of investigation in motion on their own. | The Police cannot take cognizance on their own but have to act according to the directions from Magistrate. |
| 2. Which are included in 2nd Schedule to criminal procedure code. | All other offences (under the I.P.C.) are non-cognizable. |
| 3. Police officer can arrest without warrant from the magistrate any person concerned (See 54 CrPc) | Police Officer may not arrest without a warrant from the Magistrate a person concerned |
| 4. Generally more serious offences like murder, culpable homicide dacoity etc. | Minor offences like causing simple hurt. |
- Exceptions:- Un-lawful assembly, though a minor offence in itself is cognizable.

- 2) Forgery though a serious offence is made cognizable. All Forest offences are cognizable.
