According to Section 90 of the Forest Department code CF are expected to make a detailed inspections in each division of their circles, Detailed instructions were issued through Chief Conservator of Forests Circular No. 28/63, dated. 9.8.1963 for the guidance of Conservator of Forests. Subsequent to the issuest of the Circular several changes in the jurisdiction of circles and trends of working of department have taken place. The jurisdiction of warking and divisions have been considerably frequents visited to the divisions and review the working of the Department.

Keeping in view the above and the modern trends of the Working of the Department the question of continuing the Triconnial Field Inspections of the Divisiona has been discussed at length by all the Addl. Chief Conservator of Forests and it was opined that the instructions issued in Chief Conservatoris circular mentioned above the superse-ded and fresh guidelines be issued to make the Triennial Field Inspections purposal.

It is necessary that as the senior mest Officer of the circle the CF should review the major functions activities of the Dept. in the division and give suitable advice once in three x years, and for this purpose it is enoug, the Conservator of Forests cirtically reviews the working of the Department under the following headlings to the extent indicated below.

Ocnditions of forests and theor functions:

Visa-vis management /working plans and schemes in force
resource potential for direct and indirect benefits- effects of
the scheme/plans in order to correct bad effect/pollution problems and to tackle them effectivity steps taken to increase
the forest area and potentiality of forests Review of man-made

aspect from all angles taking into accoun both bictic and nonbictic factors like fires, insects atc., recommend preventive
and remedial measures maintenance of Forest Boundaries in their

2. Nature Conservation and Wild Life Management:

Effect of exploitation on conservation of found and florax etc., problems confront d by the department in having to meet the essential demands, of the people without prejudice to conservation- Senctuaries and natural forests- Zoological parks.

3. Revenue: Target and achievements-limitations to be indicated with justification exploitation methods item -wise og. Timber/Firewood, Bamboo, Bandi leaf, MFP-Review of current motheds and results- suggestions for improvement to achieve revenue.

4. - Marketing of Forest Produce:
Review of demands of industrial and non-industrial sectors social obligations of the dopartment-arrangements made for supply of essential needs small ryots and artisens-functioning of retail depots.

5. Infrastructure:

Communication (a) review of development and maintenance of communications to facilitate explitation as well as recreation (b) buildings for accommodating officers and mon, and their maintainance, Adequacy for inadequacy of budget provision-possibilities of stapping other sources like the Tourism Dapartment for Rest houses.

6. Rationale of the existing set up: Need for re-organisation if any.

7. Social and Extention Forestry:-

Review of programmes, of afforestation, avenue plantings etc. under-taken to improve tree-over outside the Departmental forests measurers for involving the people directly in the implementation of the programmes- adequacy or inalequacy of the machinery including personnal deployed.

8. Rosearch:

Programmes undertaken by the Dapartment the Agricultural University, and the Centre-review of result suggestions.

9. Other items of interest:

- 1. Sold Orchards- Sold production argas- plus trees and other maintenance-whether concerned record is properly posted.
 - 2. Pasture development- measures taken and their resultsto be reviewed in general.
- 3. Contral journals whether field observations are recorded therein to be of use of future management.

The Conservators of Forests will sond orpics of the Trisnnial Field Inspection to the Conservators of Forests, Project Formulation Cicle, Research and Development, State Siliculturist, Forest Utilisation Officer and Working Plan Officer concerned.
