CIRCULAR NO. 21/81

Sub: - Forest Dept. -Defects and emissions noticed in the proferma prescribed by Government of India in connection for diversion of Forests lands for non-forestry uses-Reports submitted by the DFOs and CFS to the CCF-Instructions-Issued.

The Government of India while informing in the letter No.Pt-F8-4-FRY(FD) Coord., dt. 26th December 1980 with regards to replacement of Forests (Conservation) Ordinance 1980 into Bill which is now called Forest (Conservation)Bill 1980, have prescribed a proforma stating that "if there is any matter which requires the approval of Central Government in accordance with Section 2 of Forest (Conservation)Bill, 1980, it is assential that a self contained proposals must be received along with all necessary information as prescribed in the Proforma in triplicate along with the clear location sketch. Unless such a complete proposals with all necessar, information is received, it would not be possible to consider the case quickly at this end". The above said letter has been communicated in CCF's Ref.No. 78932/80/F2 dt. 16.1.1981.

Wails submitting the proferma particulars, it is observed that columns 4 to 7 of the preferma particularly relating to preposed steps to be taken to compensate for the less of forest area, the vegetation and wild Life and cut turn of timber, fuel wood and other forest produce from the Ferest land involved ate., are left blank in most of the proposals noting merely "Yes" or "Ne". Since these are very important particulars to S.fo-guard the interest of the Department and to enquire the genuincous of the case, it is impressed on the Divl. Forest Officers and Conservators of Ferests that when even the sybmit the particulars in the preferma, they should see that all columns of the preferma are duly filled in carefully and no column is left blank or vague entries made therein. They should also affix their own signature. Base on the report submitted by the Divl. Forest Officers, the Conservator of Ferests will scritinise the preferma and in turn submit afresh with his own Signature. The Chief Conservator of Ferests has to submit the same under his ewn signature to Gever ment based on CF's Preferma. The State Gevernment in turns thus will be in a position to recommend the case to Gevernment of India.

It is observed that, the Conservators of Forests are merely forwarding the Proferma as-it-is received from the Divi. For st Officer without scrutiny or just attesting along with a covering letter; cortain times true copies signed by the "Managor" or "Superintendent" are all sent. Such practice should be stopped in future. The Conservator of Forests should satisfy themselves about correctness of the particulars furnished by the Divi. Forest officers and they should submit the proforma duly filled with their own signature in triplicate along with the clear location sketchs without fail.

To avoid delay and un-necessary acrospondance, all officers are requested to scrupulously follow the above instructions while submitting the proferma to the Chief Conservator of Porests as this information has to be submitted to Government of India through State Government under the Signature of Socretary to Government, Forests and Rural Development Department.

The receipt of the circular instructions should be acknowledged by return of Post.
