

are sold in open auction in Andhra Region, are not fetching good rates as the beedi leaves traders/Exporters/Manufacturers, registered under Andhra Pradesh Forest Minor Forest Produce Regulation of Trade Act, 1971 were not informed well in advance of the sale dates of beedi leaves. As a result, due to lack of competition at sale places, the beedi leaf is being sold at cheaper rates and the contractors who have purchased this material at cheaper rates in the auctions, are re-selling the material at lower rates compared to the rates sold by the Registered traders/Exporters/Manufacturers under Minor Forest Produce (beedi Leaf) Act, effecting the sale of the registered traders.

All the Divisional Forest Officers of Andhra Region are requested to send the sale notices to the contractors whose addresses are enclosed to this circular well in advance so as to reach them at least 15 days before the sale date. They are also requested to submit 10 copies of sale notice to the Conservator of Forests, State Trading Circle, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad so that few copies may be sent to the Beedi Leaves contractors association also.

Sub:- Fire-Loss on account of fire to human life and property-collection of data-procedure-periodic of half-yearly return submission-Regarding.

The Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India have requested the State Government to furnish data on "Forest fires" among other items. The Govt. of Andhra Pradesh have designated The Director of Fire Services as the nodal officer at the State Head quarters to receive the data compile it and to furnish the same to the Fire Cell, Office of the Director, General Civil Defence, Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi.

The half-yearly periodical returns for each half-year i.e. 30th June and 31st December have to be furnished to the Director of Fire by 15th February and 14th August.

In view of the above the Conservators of Forests/Divisional Forest Officers are informed that this is a half-yearly periodical prescribed by the Government on forest fires to be submitted on the due dates. Hence they are requested to see that this periodicals is included in the list of half-yearly periodical registers of the Division and Circle and returns submitted on the dates fixed for the Division/circle. The following dates for submission of half-yearly periodicals to the Prl. Chief Conservator of Forests in the enclosed Proforma-V by the Circle are fixed.

Half year return for the	1st August.
Half year ending 30th June	
Half year return for the	1st February.
half year ending 31st December	

The Conservators of Forests may fix suitable dates for receipt of returns from the Divisional Forest Officers in their offices, such that the Circle returns to the Prl. Chief Conservator of Forests are submitted on or before the above dates fixed.

The receipt of this Circular should be acknowledged by return post in the enclosed form.
