Sub: Wild Life - Offence cases to be reported to the Chief Wildlife Warden within (24) hours of the occurence of the offences -- Instructions issued.

Hunting and trapping of Wild Animals is probhibited under the Wildlife Protection Act which has come into force from August 1973 in the Andhra Pradesh State and rules under this Act have been issued in December 1974.

It is the primary duty of every forest officer to protect the Wild Animals from poaching. It has been observed that ling of Wild Animals; but no reports are received from the concerned officers. Prompt action in detection of the officers and prosecuting the culprits in the Court of law is required to be in the Wildlife Management Circles.
