A number of reports are being published in the newspapers about extensic cutting of trees or cleaning of forests. Reports are being received from the officers, but with delay.

Government are also receiving reports though various sources. Some times ear lier then, the report from the Conservators of Forests. It is therefore x necessary that prompt reports should be made about any clearing of forests by villagers especially those which are aided for supported by Extremists. especially those which are alloed for supported by extremists. Wireless or telephone or telephonic facility should be used followed up by written confirmation. Instructions are issued in PCCFs Rc.No. 25826/90/FT2, dt. 28-3-1990, that such rewithin 24 hours. The information should contain to the within 24 hours. The information should contain to the date from which fellings commenced the locality (village, Mandal, Range & Division have of forest block). The extent of area cleared, the people indulging (name of village and number), the action taken to step such clearing etc., Such reports should also be made promptly to the District Collector and Superintendent of Police for their informa-

In view of the above situation, following instructions are i ssued for strict compliance.

- The concerned Forest Guard and other field staff should promptly report about such happenings to their superiors.
- The concerned staff should visit the area immediately and take action to register the offence case. Failure of staff to do so should be viewed very seriously and action should be taken. be made known to all staff members.
- Where things cannot be managed by our own staff singly or in groups. Police Assistance should be strong for. The Director General of Police has already given instructions to the Police Superinten-dent of al 1 the district to give Police help and take action as suggest by the Divisional Forest Officer/Conservator of Forests.

- 4) The material resulting from fellings should be extracted departmentally following the regular proceedure of numbering, measuring and classification. No timber should be allowed to be smuggled. This is very important and must be impressed on all staff. All routes etc., must be guarded and partrolled. No laxity in this direction will be tolerated and stern action will be taken against the concerned staff for laxiting lapse.
- 5) A division map should be prepared, showing all such clearings. The Conservators of Forests/Divisional Forest Officers should visit the area as early as possible to get first hand knowledge and to restore confidence and morals of staff.

The detailed proceedure to follow by the Forest Divisions in connection with the collection of sales tax amounts in the sale of Forest coupes, about leaves etc., has been i sued by the Accountant General, A.P., Hyderabad in his circular cited. According to which, the sales taxes amount collected should be credited in the departmental cash book under the head Forest the total amount realised as sales taxes during the month that to on the last day of the month.

Consequent on introduction of treasury system in Forest Department with effect from 114-1989, the forest officers can operate cheques obly for works expendture. Hence issue of cheques for sales tax is against the rules. Hence all the officers are advised that the sale taxes collected may be credited through challan to the sale taxes departmental head and note the challan No. and date in our records for information that the sale tax was collected and then only deliver the produce.

The above proceedure should be followed in future.
