Sub:- Estt & P.D. Deputation of Subordinates to W.L.
and other Special Divisions - Reducting the deputa-
tion period from (3) years to (2) years - Instruc-
tions - issued - Regarding.

Under the provision made in the A.P. Forest Subordinate Service Rules, the posts of Forest Guards, Foresters, Deputy Range Officers and Forest Range Officers in the State Office Institutions i.e. Forest School, Yellandu, Research and Department Circle and Project Formulation Circle, Hyderabad including Forest Utilization Office and State Trading Circle, Hyd. notified under the Presidential Order shall be filled by drafting persons from each of the local cadres, on equitable basis in such ratio as may be specified by the Chief Conservator of Forests from time to time for a period not exceeding three years at a time'. As per the recent instructions is vide Prl. Chief Conservator of Forests Ref.No. 59261/89/T2, dated 23-11-1990, the Wild Life Offices cease to act as independent units and the posts of common categories existing in Wild Life Wing have also to be filled in by drafting personnel from the respective territorial divisions on tenure basis.

Keeping in view the above provision, generally the Subordinates are drafted to State level and special offices on tenure basis initially for a period of (1) year or (2) years and, if necessary, it is extended beyond (2) years upto a maximum period of three years.

However, it is decided to continue the individuals on tenure basis generally for (2) years only and on completion of their tenure period of (2) years they would be repatriated to their Parent divisions/circles.

All the Conservators of Forests/Divisional Forest Officers are requested to make note of the above orders and take necessary action and communicate the same to all the subordinates working under them without fail. They are also requested to dispel the notion prevailing among the subordinates that if they are transferred to State level/Special offices especially Wild Life divisions, they will loose their seniority and promotion chances in their parent divisions. The transfer is only on tenure basis and their lben and seniority will continue to maintained in their parent divisions only. After completion of tenure period they will be brought back to their parent divisions. The requests for cancellation of allotment on tenure basis, received from the staff, should not be entertain in normal course and the officers should be firm in dealing with such cases.
